Hematopathology Fellowship

Description: This 1- or 2-year fellowship offers training in lymph node and bone marrow interpretation, flow cytometry, molecular pathology, cytogenetics, immunohistochemistry, laboratory hematology and coagulation. It is expected that the fellow will participate in a research project in the division. More extensive research opportunities can be arranged for fellows spending two years. The fellowship is approved by the ACGME and upon completion of the one-year program, a fellow is eligible for the American Board of Pathology subspecialty examination in Hematology.

Requirements: Candidate must have completed training in an approved residency in combined Anatomic and Clinical pathology, straight Anatomic Pathology or straight Clinical Pathology. Eligibility for Pennsylvania licensure is required.

Facilities: Hematopathology Services are provided by 8 hematopathologists based at UPMC Presbyterian Hospital. The Division of Hematopathology is responsible for an adult and pediatric bone marrow service, a solid tissue (lymph node) hematopathology service, a flow cytometry laboratory and hematology laboratories. Fellows also rotate in the Division of Molecular Diagnostics, in the University of Pittsburgh's Clinical Cytogenetics Laboratory and on a specialized coagulation service.

Stipends: Stipends are commensurate with year of postgraduate training.
