Clinical Microbiology Fellowship

Description: The University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine offers a two-year fellowship for training in clinical microbiology. Training is provided in all aspects of clinical microbiology, including bacteriology, antimicrobial susceptibility testing, anaerobic bacteriology, mycology, mycobacteriology, parasitology, serology, virology and molecular infectious disease testing. The fellow interacts with other areas of Laboratory Medicine, is an active participant with the Infectious Diseases Division, and is involved in clinical research activities. The program is accredited by the American Academy of Microbiology and fellows are eligible for board certification by the American Board of Medical Microbiology.

Requirements: Candidates must have completed training in clinical pathology, medical microbiology, or other specialty with training in infectious diseases. A doctoral degree including MD, PhD, or equivalent is required.

Stipends: Stipend is commensurate with year of postgraduate training.
