Description: We currently offer a four-year combined AP/CP program. The AP/CP program consists of a 44-month core program consisting of 25 months of AP and 19 months of CP. The faculty work with the residents to provide an elective program that provides a sound educational experience in the resident's chosen area of concentration, as well as flexibility to the resident's level of expertise and career goals. During the elective time, residents are encouraged to spend time in research or in subspecialty training electives.

Types and Numbers of Appointments: Sixteen resident training positions are available.

Facilities: The University of Kansas Medical Center (KUMC) consists of the University of Kansas Medical School, a School of Nursing and School of Allied Health. The University of Kansas Hospital is a university teaching hospital of 620 active beds with clinical facilities accommodating 474,165 outpatient visits per year. Annually, the clinical laboratory at KUMC performs approximately 1,800,000 laboratory determinations, processes 22,000 surgical pathology and 18,500 cytology accessions. Additional hospital affiliations include a 157-bed Veterans Affairs Medical Center integrated with the program at the KU Hospital. The laboratory at the VA performs approximately 2 million clinical laboratory determinations and processes 7,500 surgical pathology accessions a year. A much used modern student center and fitness center provide areas for relaxation and conferences. The Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine consists of resident and trainee offices, a departmental library, conference rooms, modern and well-equipped autopsy and surgical pathology suites and expanded clinical laboratory facilities. State-of-the-art slide imaging and telemedicine systems are in routine use. Numerous research laboratories within the department focus on molecular oncology, maternal-fetal biology, bone pathology and renal pathology. Computer facilities are readily available.

Community: Kansas City is a metropolitan area with a population of over 2 million. It's beautiful rolling hills and woodlands with numerous parks provide both land and water recreation. Several colleges and universities offer excellent educational opportunities. Numerous cultural facilities include museums, opera, theater and symphony. A variety of amateur and professional sports and outdoor activities are available. Cost of living is reasonable and several local communities are ranked among the best places to live in the country.

Stipends: Pathology resident stipends for 2013-2014 ranged from \$45,023 for first year residents to \$48,568 for fourth year. Apartments and reasonably priced houses are plentiful within a convenient distance from the medical center. Fringe benefits also include professional liability insurance, personal health insurance, uniform laundry, parking, and a travel and book allowance.

Applications: Trainees must be graduates of approved medical schools in the U.S. or foreign countries at the time they begin training. ECFMG certification is necessary for foreign graduates. Satisfactory references are required. Personal interviews are required. Applications should be received by November 1, 2013 for appointments beginning July 1, 2014. We will only accept applications that are submitted through the Electronic Residency Application System (ERAS).
