Description: Houston Methodist Hospital, Department of Pathology and Genomic Medicine, in Houston, Texas, an affiliate of Weill Cornell Medical College, offers an ACGME-accredited fellowship in Surgical Pathology for physicians who have completed pathology specialty training and are interested in strengthening and specializing their skills in surgical pathology and related research. Located in the heart of the Texas Medical Center, Houston Methodist Hospital is a 950-bed private adult teaching hospital with a 1.6 million square foot outpatient center that registers over 310,000 annual outpatient visits with over 30,000 annual surgical accessions. The hospital offers a full range of services from primary to tertiary care, including a multi-organ transplant center and cancer center. Five one-year fellowship positions are offered every academic year. In addition to advanced training in general surgical pathology, the fellowship provides experiences in a broad spectrum of subspecialty areas under the guidance of board-certified faculty experts. Electives in surgical subspecialty areas, as well as in immunohistochemistry, flow cytometry, molecular diagnostics, hematopathology, and cytopathology are available. Rotation on a busy consultation service is included. Experience in quality management, laboratory management, teaching junior residents, and tumor board participation are part of the fellowship. Special rotations elsewhere in the Texas Medical Center may be arranged, e.g., The University of Texas HSC at Houston, the University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center, Ben Taub General Hospital, etc. Fellows assume responsibility commensurate with his/her level of training experience. Fellows are expected to participate in scholarly activities leading to publication.

Requirements: At least two years of training in Anatomic Pathology. Preferably AP or AP/CP Board-eligible. Candidates must be eligible for a Texas Physician In Training Permit or hold a Full Physician Texas Licensure.

Stipends: Commensurate with level of post-graduate training.
